Target Zero Statewide Inititive

Target Zero is a statewide initiative to reduce the number of transportation-related serious injuries and deaths across Florida to ZERO.

Target Zero builds on Vision Zero by focusing on influencing dangerous driver behaviors before then lead to serious and fatal crashes. Target Zero is accomplished through extensive education and awareness, messaging and community collaboration.
